b. Why is Greek architecture known to be carpentry in marble? Elaborate your answer with illustrations. (10 Marks)

- 3 a. Briefly state the characteristics of Roman architecture with sketches. (10 Marks)
b. Illustrate plan, sections and a view of a colosseum at Rome. (10 Marks)

- 4 a. Illustrate Tuscan orders of Roman period. (10 Marks)
b. With the help of plan and section, narrate various characteristics of Pantheon temple. (10 Marks)

Module-3

- 5 a. Explain the hypocaust system of the Roman baths with neat sketches. (10 Marks)
b. Define the purposes of triumphal arches with any one example. (10 Marks)

OR

- 6 Explain with a typical plan and section of early Christian church and highlight the function of each part. (20 Marks)

Module-4

- 7 a. Briefly explain the characteristics of Byzantine architecture. (08 Marks)
b. With a neat plan and section explain the Hagia Sophia at Istanbul. (12 Marks)

OR

- 8 Illustrate with sketch the Pisa complex and give details of any one of the building. (20 Marks)

Module-5

- 9 Explain the characteristic features of Gothic architecture with neat sketches. (20 Marks)

OR

- 10 Highlight the Gothic architectural features through Notre Dame, (Paris) church with neat sketches. (20 Marks)
