b. What are the 7 questions that define a ship design? Explain. (10 Marks)

- 8 a. Explain the design of a dry bulk carries with a neat diagram. (10 Marks)
b. Explain the 3 types of liquids petroleum gas tanker (LPG). (10 Marks)

- 9 Explain the 10 stages in a ship building production process. (20 Marks)
